Food Donation Drop-Off at DPW

The Union Beach Department of Public Works is still accepting donations of non-perishable food items. All donations will be brought to the Keyport Ministerium Food Pantry. Please consider making a donation, especially if you're dropping off recycling! Items which are always needed include: pasta, pasta sauce, canned vegetables, tuna fish, peanut butter, jelly and cereal. Please make sure all items are not past their expiration dates. Let's make sure that no one in our community goes hungry!

Dumpster/Storage Container Permits

EVERY dumpster and container used in the Borough of Union Beach **MUST** have a proper permit. All dumpsters/containers **MUST** be placed on property. Special permission to use the street may be given in extreme cases only. Permits cost \$30 and are good for thirty (30) days. Recycling — Did You Know?

Municipalities in Monmouth County generate tons of garbage each year. Most of it is transported to the Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls, where it will stay forever. Special steps are taken to make sure that odor, pests and generated gases are controlled and that fluid run-off does not pollute our groundwater.

Currently, only about 63% of the garbage in Monmouth County is recycled. While some people feel that recycling is not worth the time, recyclable items do NOT go to the landfill, which saves money and protects the environment. Recycled items can also be made into new products.

Household Hazardous Waste Facility

The Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste Facility is located in Tinton Falls. The phone number is 732-683-8686. Always call before you go, as their hours change daily. This is where residents can take many items that are not picked up curbside, and re not accepted at the Recycling Center in Union Beach. Some of things they accept are: fire extinguishers, propane tanks, household chemicals, etc. Remember, latex paint containers become regular garbage once they are completely dried up.

With the change of season(s) come roadway challenges. Just a reminder from the UBPD—Traffic Safety Bureau to keep roadways clear of obstacles (i.e., portable basketball hoops, hockey nets, garbage cans, etc.) so that our hard working Union Beach Department of Public Works (UBDPW) team can safety and efficiently keep the roadways free and clear in the event of inclement weather (snow); the UBDPW covers over 25.6 miles of roadway in our two (2) square mile area. Please also continue to use due caution at Memorial Elementary School, especially during drop-off and pick-up times. In the event you observe careless driving, please advise a police officer so as to address the issue immediately.

The UBPD handles nearly 12,000 calls for service per annum. Our dedicated, professional, and devoted police officers are equipped and trained to handle any given situation that presents itself; no job is too big or too small. Although the UBPD has been recognized internationally for "policing excellence" it is the accolades we receive from our residents on a daily basis that are most important. Union Beach truly is the best place to reside anywhere, not only due to the gorgeous ecosystem we inhabit, but once again, due to the people that reside here.

Union Beach Board of Health

January is "Dog Licensing Month." It is a state law that all dogs be licensed. Registration for a dog license is now available on our web site at <u>ubnj.net</u>, or in person at Borough Hall. To register your dog, the rabies vaccine must be up to date. The rabies vaccination must be valid through October 31, 2025.

The cost is \$10 for neutered/spayed or \$13 for non-neutered/spayed dogs. There is a late fee of \$15 per dog beginning February 1, 2025. If you no longer have your dog, please advise the Board of Health. For critter issues, please call the SPCA at 732-383-1090.

<u>Tenant Landlord Registration</u> is required to be renewed on an annual basis. All Union Beach rental property owners, MUST be registered through the Borough's web site on <u>ubnj.net</u> on the front page icon at "<u>Tenant Landlord Registration</u>" or in person at Borough Hall. The annual registration is \$50, and must be completed by February 15, 2025. Call 732-264-2277 with any questions.

<u>Business/Rental Insurance</u> is required to be renewed on an annual basis. All Union Beach rental property owners, and any business with any on-site visitors, MUST be registered through the Borough's web site <u>ubnj.net</u> on the front page icon at "<u>Business/Rental Insurance</u>" or in person at Borough Hall. The annual registration is \$25, and must be completed by March 1, 2025. Reminder: Submit a copy of proof of insurance any time the policy expires. Call 732-264-2277 with any questions.

Memorial School

On February 1, 2025, preschool registration for next school year (2025-2026) will begin. Any 3– or 4-year-old <u>resident</u> is eligible for free full-day preschool. Disposal of Branches/Brush/Grass Clippings

Our garbage contractor will accept branches/brush along with your regular garbage pick-up—on the second pick-up of the week (either Thursday or Friday). Branches MUST be bundled. Bundles CANNOT be more than 4 feet in length and CANNOT weigh more than 50 pounds. Anything larger than 3 inches in diameter MUST be cut up. If branches are too small to bundle, they should be placed in a can, the weight of which should NOT exceed 50 pounds. The contractor will accept only THREE bundles or cans at a time. PLEASE NOTE: The garbage contractor does not accept grass clippings; neither does the Department of Public Works. We recommend that you leave cut grass on your lawn, as it is actually good for your lawn.

Engineer's Corner

Borough Engineer, Edward Broberg, P.E., provided the following information concerning the status of ongoing construction projects:

Reconstruction of Fifth Street

The Reconstruction of Fifth Street from Florence Avenue to Pine Street — The improvements include the installation of drainage, new concrete curbs, and sidewalks, where it exists today, and a reconstruction of the existing roadway surface. We anticipate the project to be included in the 2025 Roadway Improvement Program.

Scholer Park Improvements Phase X

The Borough received a grant in the amount of \$300,000 from the Monmouth County Open Space Grant program for Scholer Park Improvements Phase X. The improvements include the installation of Sports Lighting at existing ball fields. We anticipate the construction to begin late Spring 2025.

Army Corps of Engineers Flood Control Project

The construction contract for Phase I of the multi phased shore protection project is completed and the beach was open to the public early 2024. The contractor will be planting the remaining sections of dune grass in early Winter of 2024/2025. The Corps continues with the design plans for the remaining phases of the project. The design plans for Phase II are scheduled to be completed in early 2027.

2025 New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant

The Borough was awarded a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant program in the amount of \$217,456 for the Roadway and Drainage Improvements along Park Avenue from the Flat Creek Bridge to Union Avenue. The improvements will include the installation of certain drainage, installation of certain sections of new concrete curbs and sidewalks, and milling and resurfacing of the existing roadway. We anticipate the project to be included in the 2025 Roadway Improvement Program.

2025 Turf Maintenance Program

On-Site Landscape continues in the Spring of 2025 with the second year of a three-year contract for the Turf Maintenance Program for all ball fields, parks, and open space areas throughout the Borough. The Turf Maintenance Program includes the fertilization and treatment of all athletic fields and common-grassed areas within the Borough.

Happy New Year to all! The Library hours are Monday from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.; and Wednesday and Friday from 1 to 5 p.m. We are adding new items to our children's section: toys for toddlers!

I hope everyone had an enjoyable and memorable Holiday Season with friends and family.

Our annual Reorganization Meeting will take place on Friday, January 3rd at 6:30 p.m. at Borough Hall. At that time, we will be administering the oath of office to our many volunteers and professional staff, as well as our Re-elected Council members, Albin J. Wicki and Eileen Woodruff. This meeting is open to all who wish to attend.

As many of us do in our personal lives, as we begin the New Year, I would like to look back on the accomplishments of the past year and some of the plans we have in store for the New Year.

Highlights of 2024:

- Phase One of the Army Corps of Engineers Flood Protection Project at the beachfront was completed in time for the summer season.
- Concrete repair and repaving of Park Avenue, Phase II from Pine Street to the bridge deck over Flat Creek was completed.
 This included raising a portion of the roadway between Spruce Street and the bridge deck to minimize road closures due to flooding.
- Reconstruction of 8th Street between Florence Ave & Pine Street
- Three newly constructed Pickle Ball Courts were added to Scholer Park.
- A new lighted and paved walking trail was constructed at Scholer Park that stretches around the baseball & softball fields.
- Florence Avenue bridge deck was reconstructed by Monmouth County and the adjacent roadway to the south was raised to
 minimize road closures due to flooding events. The project included replacement of sidewalks on both sides of the road.

Plans for 2025:

- Installation of lighting around the baseball and softball fields at Scholer Park utilizing a \$300,000 Monmouth County Open Space Grant that was awarded to the Borough
- Concrete repair and repaving of Park Avenue, Phase III from the Flat Creek bridge deck to Union Avenue utilizing a \$217,456 grant from NJ Department of Transportation
- Reconstruction of 5th Street between Florence Avenue and Pine Street
- Continued commitment to maintenance and facility improvement upgrades at all of our parks and beachfront

Finally, remember that this is the time to make your preparations for bad weather. Despite our hope for a mild winter, we are sure to get a few snow events. Avoid the last-minute rush once snow is in the forecast. We also ask that in the event of snow, please make every effort to move your vehicles off the street (where possible) to allow our Public Works department the room they require to clear your street.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to say THANK YOU to all of our volunteers, first responders, borough employees, administrative and professional staff and Borough Council members for their hard work and dedication each and every day to make Union Beach the Best Little Town in New Jersey!
