SPECIAL Recycling Pick-Up



The same rules apply as for when you have a regular Wednesday pick-up. Please put everything at the curb the night before and do not use plastic bags of any kind.



Christmas Tree Pick-Up

The Public Works Department will be picking up Christmas trees beginning Tuesday, January 7, through Wednesday, January 29, 2019. The schedule will be the same as it was for leaf pick-up. Residents in Section B (with regular trash pick-ups on Mondays and Thursdays) will have a pick-up on Tuesdays. Residents in Section A (with regular trash pick-ups on Tuesdays and Fridays) will have a pick-up on Wednesdays. Please make sure all trees are at the curb the night before your scheduled pick-up and that all decorations are removed including lights and tinsel. In the event of snow, please be patient with the DPW, as that may become their priority. Residents may also bring their trees to the Recycling Center located at 1400 Florence Avenue. Please sign in at the office before disposing of your tree.

Snow Removal/Deicing Policies and Procedures from the Department of Public Works

The removal of snow, and deicing of Borough roads, is performed by the Department of Public Works. All snow equipment is deployed by the Director, as needed, after reviewing current conditions and forecasts made available by electronic media and in working closely with the Police, Fire, and First Aid Departments, the School Superintendent, and the Office of Emergency Management by two-way radio communication and cell phones to ensure that our road system is made as safe as possible in a timely, cost effective, and efficient manner for the residents we serve.

It is during these times that our roads are prioritized to always allow Emergency Services (Fire, First Aid and OEM) safe travel to help residents during a situation requiring the transportation to a local hospital, a household fire or other emergency where the Office of Emergency Management is needed.

First priority roads would include roads that directly connect to County and State roads such as Poole, Park, Morningside, Front, etc. with secondary roads being Central, Center, Lorillard, and so on. We also assist with the County roads that run through the Borough, as needed, to improve conditions for our residents.

Following these additional guidelines will also help us in serving the residents in a more effective manner during any snow or ice emergency:

- Please do not pass our snow plows during any emergency snow operations.
- Please park all vehicles off the street whenever snow is in the forecast.
- Basketball hoops should be removed from the street in front of your house.
- As you stand in front of your house looking at it, please shovel or plow any snow you remove from your driveway to the left side so when one of our snowplows comes down your street, the snow you have shoveled is taken away from your driveway, not put back in it.
- After any plowable snowfall we receive, please keep your garbage and recycling cans out of the street.

Please do not shovel/plow/blow snow back into the street.

Fall Leaf Collection Program

We would like to thank all the residents of Union Beach who continue to help make our Fall Leaf Collection Program a huge success once again! Leaves were collected, in brown biodegradable bags only, curbside on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. In addition, many residents brought leaves to the Recycling Center and deposited them directly into the dumpster which we made available. This greatly helped us in complying with NJDEP Regulations. All leaves were properly recycled.

We will be collecting leaves curbside again, in biodegradable bags only, next Fall from October 27 to December 23, 2020. The dumpster at the Recycling Center will be available to residents on a year-round basis. You may bring leaves in any type of container and empty them directly into the dumpster. Biodegradable bags are available at the Public Works Department located at 1400 Florence Avenue, while supplies last.

Clean Communities

Thank you to everyone who helped make our Clean Communities Day (October 5) a huge success! One hundred and sixty five (165) volunteers collected 960 pounds of trash and recyclables!

Once again, Texas Road House donated trays of pulled pork with bread, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all!

Disposal of Branches/Brush/Grass Clippings

Our garbage contractor will accept branches/brush along with your regular garbage pick-up—preferably on the second pick-up of the week (either Thursday or Friday). Branches MUST be bundled. Bundles CANNOT be more than 4 feet in length and CANNOT weigh more than 50 pounds. Anything larger than 3 inches in diameter MUST be cut up. If branches are too small to bundle, they should be placed in a can, the weight of which should NOT exceed 50 pounds. The contractor will accept only THREE bundles or cans at a time. PLEASE NOTE: The garbage contractor does not accept grass clippings; neither does the Department of Public Works. We recommend that you leave cut grass on your lawn, as it actually good for your lawn.

Message from the Code Enforcement Office

The Code Enforcement Office is asking that you please:

- 1. Don't pump water into the street. It must run onto your own property.
- 2. Put house numbers on all homes that are visible from the street.
- 3. On properties with no buildings, put either the address, or block and lot number, on a board large enough to be seen from the street.

The Code Enforcement Office would like to thank all the residents that have been maintaining their homes and properties over these past months.

Recycling

When recycling cardboard/paper, you may include mixed paper including chipboard (cereal boxes), white/color paper, junk mail, magazines, soft cover books and non-metallic wrapping paper. DO NOT INCLUDE: pizza boxes, or other food-stained cardboard; food wrappers; paper plates and cups; napkins or paper towels; or newspaper used for pet waste or household projects.

When recycling commingle (cans and bottles), you may include aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles, and plastic bottles that are "Type 1" and "Type 2" with a pourable neck smaller than the body. All must be rinsed out before disposal. DO NOT INCLUDE: any plastics that do not have a pourable neck, plastic bags, margarine tubs, diaper wipes containers, yogurt cups, or food storage containers.

Please remember, do not use plastic bags when disposing of recyclable materials. Your recycling <u>WILL NOT</u> be picked up if you place it at the curb in plastic bags. Do not use plastic bags when disposing of recycling at the Recycling Center.

Engineer's Corner

Borough Engineer, Edward Broberg, P.E., provided the following information concerning the status of ongoing construction projects:

FY 2019 NJDOT Municipal Aid Application — The Borough has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$291,000 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant Program for the Reconstruction of Ocean Avenue Phase II from Columbia Avenue to Lorillard Avenue. The improvements include new concrete curbs and sidewalks, drainage and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway. The project will be part of the 2020 Roadway Improvement Program. We anticipate construction to begin the Spring of 2020.

FY 2020 NJDOT Municipal Aid Application — The Borough has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$350,000 from the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant Program for the Reconstruction of Lorillard Avenue from Poole Avenue to its western terminus. The improvements will include new concrete curbs, drainage, and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway.

2019 Monmouth County Community Development Grant Application — The Borough has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$156,647 from the Monmouth County Community Development Grant Program for the Reconstruction of Ninth Street from Florence Avenue to Pine Street. The improvements include installation of new concrete curbs, drainage and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway. If the funds are available from HUD in early 2020, the project will be part of the 2020 Roadway Improvement Program. We anticipate the 2020 Roadway Improvement Program to begin in the Spring of 2020.

FY 2020 Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program — The Borough has applied to the Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program for the installation of two new Tee Ball Baseball fields at Scholer Park. If successful, we anticipate construction to begin in the Summer of 2020.

Army Corps of Engineers Flood Control Project — The Governing Body continues to work closely with the State and Army Corps officials on the acquisition of easements from the property owners impacted by Phase I construction. The Phase I project consists of the beach fill element of the project extending from the westerly most end of the shore front (point) to Flat Creek. The Corps is presently completing the final design plans and specifications for Phase I and is prepared to advertise for construction bids. However, all easements must be secured prior to the project being advertised for construction bids. We remain cautiously optimistic that the easement acquisition process will move quickly so the Phase I project can be advertised for construction bids sometime in 2020.

Sport Lighting Helen Hayes Soccer Fields — The Borough was recently awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 from the Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program for the installation of Sports Lighting at the Helen Hayes Park Soccer Fields. The project is now completed, and the lights were operational in time for the Fall Soccer Season.

2019 Turf Maintenance Program — The Borough's Turf Maintenance Contractor completed the second year of a three-year contract. The Turf Maintenance Program includes the fertilization and treatment of all athletic fields and common grassed areas within the Borough. The Spring application is scheduled to begin in March 2020, weather permitting.

Highlights of 2019:

- Grant funds from NJDOT and Community Development Block Grant programs assisted with the Ocean and St. James Avenues projects.
- Continued with additional improvements to Scholer Park. Canopies for the players on the softball field have been installed.
- Lighting on the Helen Hayes Soccer Complex has been installed with help from a Monmouth County Open Space Grant in the amount of \$125,000.
- The Borough Hall expansion/renovation project is well underway. The parking lot has taken shape with many additional parking spaces when completed.

Plans for 2020:

- Ocean Ave. Phase II Road Reconstruction Project to be partially funded by a \$291,000 NJDOT Grant.
- Application has been made for the next round of CDBG funds which we hope will help us with Ninth Street from Florence Avenue to Pine Street.
- Completion of the expansion and renovation of Borough Hall by late summer
- Continue to address the numerous abandoned properties in the borough.
- Updated radio system for our Police and Emergency Services.

Finally, remember that this is the time to make your preparations for the bad weather. Despite our hope for a mild winter, we are sure to get a couple of snow events. Avoid the last minute rush once snow is in the forecast.

I want to thank the entire Council along with all of our borough employees and professional staff for their hard work and dedication each and every day to make Union Beach the Best Little Town in New Jersey!
