A Message from the Code Enforcement Office

The Code Enforcement Office would like to thank those residents that are helping to keep our town looking beautiful. We are still asking for help with the following items:

1. All empty lots must be identified with either the address or the block and lot of the property. Identification must be large enough to be seen easily and in a place that is visible from the street.

2. All homes and businesses must have a house number on them that is large enough to be visible from the street.

3. When cutting your lawn, please be sure to cut the entire lawn, front and back. **DO NOT** blow cut grass, weeds, or leaves into the street.

4. Basketball hoops may **NOT** be left in the street when not being used.

Clean Communities Day

Join us on Saturday, October 5, as Union Beach holds Clean Communities Day! All participants MUST pre-register, as Waivers of Liability need to be in place, prior to the event and we need a head count for breakfast and lunch. You may print waivers from the Borough's web site at www.ubnj.net. Click on the Clean Communities page. Participants may sign up to meet at Borough Hall either by 8:30 a.m. or by 9:30 a.m. where they will be offered a continental breakfast. Safety during the clean-up will be discussed; t-shirts will be distributed; and gloves and trash bags will be provided.

Upon return at either 11:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m., a light lunch will be provided and "goody" bags will be distributed. Mini-grants up to \$100 are available for a limited number of organized groups (such as scouts; church, school, or civic groups; and other similar organized groups). Mini-grants will be distributed at the November Council Meeting on Monday, November 25. Strict rules apply regarding adult supervision of minors. Areas to be cleaned will be determined based on the number of participants, but can include the beachfront and all Borough parks. This event will be held RAIN OR SHINE, so please dress appropriately.

Union Beach Board of Health

The Monmouth County Mosquito Control Division (MCMCD) provides mosquito control to the residents of Monmouth County. The primary strategy for mosquito control relies on an Integrated Pest Management approach that focuses on controlling mosquito larvae versus broad control of adult mosquitoes. Much of the effort is on source control — reducing or eliminating the standing water where mosquito larvae live. The staff of the MCMCD can answer your questions and concerns about mosquitoes. Some plants may be toxic so check into pet friendly indoor and outside plants.

Clean up after your pets in the yard within 12 hours during the months of May through October and within 24 hours during the months of November through April.

All are welcome to join us!



Disposal of Branches/Brush/Grass Clippings

Our garbage contractor will accept branches/brush along with your regular garbage pick-up—preferably on the second pick-up of the week (either Thursday or Friday). Branches MUST be bundled. Bundles CANNOT be more than 4 feet in length and CANNOT weigh more than 50 pounds. Anything larger than 3 inches in diameter MUST be cut up. If branches are too small to bundle, they should be placed in a can, the weight of which should NOT exceed 50 pounds. The contractor will accept only THREE bundles or cans at a time. PLEASE NOTE: The garbage contractor does not accept grass clippings; neither does the Department of Public Works. We recommend that you leave cut grass on your lawn, as it actually good for your lawn.

Message from UB Chief of Police, Michael J. Woodrow

On behalf of the men and women of the UBPD, we wish to welcome our residents and visitors alike to the much anticipated exciting Summer season! We hope you enjoy the many outdoor recreational activities that are available in the beautiful ecosystem we call Union Beach. We have an incredibly unique diversity of wildlife; i.e., the American Bald Eagle(s), Humpback Whale(s), Dolphin(s), Seal(s), Pelican(s), Osprey, Hawk(s), etc. School is out which equates to an exponential increase in pedestrian traffic. Last year, the UBPD issued an astonishing (nearly 2,000) traffic summonses; last month, well over 200 were issued.

Please help keep our community clean and discard trash in the proper receptacles as well as look after your pet; a small doggie bag will suffice. In case of an emergency or if you simply have a concern, please call us at 732-264-0313. No job is to big or small for our officers; the UBPD had an incredible number of calls for service in 2018 (nearly 12,000). We truly live in the best town in the State, not just due to the scenic beauty, but most importantly, due to the residents!

Engineer's Corner

Borough Engineer, Edward Broberg, P.E., provided the following information concerning the status of ongoing construction projects:

Reconstruction of Ocean Avenue Phase I—The Borough was awarded a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant Program in the amount of \$350,000 for the Reconstruction of Ocean Avenue Phase I from Cambridge Avenue to New Jersey State Highway Route 36. The improvements will include new concrete curbs and sidewalks, drainage and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway. The construction contract was awarded to Lancha Construction Group, Jamesburg, NJ as part of the 2019 Roadway Improvement Program. We anticipate construction to begin sometime late June or early July, 2019.

Reconstruction of St. John's Avenue — The construction contract for St. John's Avenue was awarded as part of the 2019 Roadway Improvement Program. The reconstruction projects consists of the installation of new concrete curbs and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway from Florence Avenue to the northerly terminus. The installation of the new concrete curbs is completed. We anticipate the roadway base course paving to be completed by the end of

June, 2019 with the final pavement surface course to be completed mid- to late Summer, 2019.

Reconstruction of Campbell Street —The construction contract for Campbell Street was awarded as part of the 2019 Roadway Improvement Program. The reconstruction consists of the installation of new concrete curbs and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway from St. John's Avenue to the westerly terminus. The installation of new concrete curbs is now completed. We anticipate the roadway base course paving to be completed by the end of June, 2019 with the final pavement surface course to be completed mid—to late Summer, 2019.

Reconstruction of St. James Avenue — The Borough was awarded a grant in the amount of \$173,636.00 from the Monmouth County Community Development Grant Program (CDBG) for the Reconstruction of St. James Avenue from Poole Avenue to Tenth Street. The construction contract for St. James Avenue was awarded as part of the 2019 Roadway Improvement Program. The improvements include new concrete curbs, drainage, and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway. The project is now underway, and we anticipate all construction to be completed mid—to late Summer, 2019, weather permitting.

FY2019 NJDOT Municipal Aid Application — The Borough recently submitted a grant application to the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid Grant Program for the Reconstruction of Ocean Avenue Phase II from Columbia Avenue to Lorillard Avenue. The improvements will include new concrete curbs and sidewalks, drainage

and a total reconstruction of the existing roadway.

2018 Turf Maintenance Program — The Borough's Turf Maintenance Contractor continues with the fertilization and treatment of all athletic fields and common grassed areas within the Borough. The Spring application is

underway.

Army Corps of Engineers Flood Control Project — The Governing Body continues to work closely with the State and Army Corps officials to keep this most important project on its current project schedule. The Borough recently received the draft state agreement for funding and is in the process of reviewing and executing the said agreement. The Corps is presently completing the final design plans and specifications for Phase I. The Phase I project consists of the beach fill element of the project extending from the westerly most end of the shore front (point) to Flat Creek. The Borough has sent easement documents to properties affected by the Phase I project and will begin discussion with those residents concerning the acquisition of easements. It is important that these easements be obtained in a timely fashion so as not to delay the project further. All easements must be secured prior to the project being advertised for construction bids. We remain cautiously optimistic that the easement acquisition process will move quickly so the Phase I project can be advertised for construction bids mid—to late, 2019.

Improvements to Scholer Park — The improvements to Scholer Park continue with certain drainage improvements in and around the ball fields. The Borough recently completed minor pavement improvements as well as a rehabilitation

program for the ball field infield areas to improve the drainage of the ball fields.

Sports Lighting Helen Hayes Soccer Fields — The Borough recently awarded a grant in the amount of \$125,000 from the Monmouth County Open Space Grant program for the installation of Sports Lighting at the Helen Hayes Park Soccer Fields. A construction contract was recently awarded to Quality Electrical Construction Co., Holmdel, NJ for the installation of sports lighting. We anticipate the lighting will be ready for the Fall soccer season. The use of the lights will be restricted to certain times during the week and weekends.

A Message from Mayor Paul J. Smith, Jr.

Hello Friends,

Happy Summer. I hope you all get a chance to spend some time relaxing with friends and family over the next couple of months. If you get a chance to enjoy our beautiful beachfront, remember that parking is free for all Union Beach residents. You can obtain your decal at Borough Hall; just be sure to bring a copy of your vehicle registration and your driver's license with you.

You will notice a lot of road construction going on throughout the borough this summer. You can see the specific projects in the "Engineer's Corner" of this newsletter. Please use caution when driving in

these areas to keep the workers safe.

The Council adopted the 2019 Municipal budget recently. Included in that budget are the many road projects which I mentioned above, lighting for the Helen Hayes Soccer Complex, various pieces of Police equipment and includes the *reduction* in the residential sewer rates as I talked about in the last newsletter. Even with all of these improvements in the borough, we are able to provide the residents with a decrease of 3.5 cents per \$100 of assessed value on the municipal purposes tax rate. Thank you to the Finance Committee, the Borough Hall employees and the finance professionals who worked on creating a fiscally responsible budget which brings tax relief to our residents.

We had our annual Memorial Day parade on May 25th. It was wonderful to see so many residents along with family and friends enjoying the day. It would not have been possible without the efforts of so many volunteers and borough workers who came together to make our hometown look so beautiful. Our Emergency Services volunteers held a beautiful service at Firefighters Park in the morning followed by a ceremony by American Legion Post 321. We are reminded how important it is to always keep in mind that the freedoms we enjoy each and every day are made possible by those who served and many who

made the ultimate sacrifice for us.
